

## Restrictive Practices Policy

## Purpose

To ensure the appropriate use of practices that are restrictive and to reduce and eliminate the use of such practices.

## Policy

Rocky Bay is always trying to eliminate and limit the number of restrictive practices used within its services. Sometimes, however, there may be a need to put measures in place that are restrictive to keep customers and others safe.

The NDIS has rules on the use of restrictive practices that Rocky Bay, as a registered provider, must follow. There are five types of restrictive practices under these rules:

**Physical** – someone using part of their own body to stop a customer from doing something.

**Chemical** – the use of medications to control or influence customer behaviour.

**Seclusion** – confining a customer to a space from which they cannot get out.

**Mechanical** – using equipment to stop a customer from doing something.

**Environmental** – stopping a customer from having access to something or somewhere.

Any restrictive practice used at Rocky Bay will:

- Be the least restrictive option
- Be used for the least possible time
- Be used as a last resort
- Be necessary to prevent harm to you or others
- Not be used as a punishment to you
- Not be used for staff convenience
- Have your agreement, where possible
- Be reported to the NDIS
